
# June 4-8 Vacation Bible School "Take Me to the Water"

# MARION BONTRAGER TO LEAD MINISTER'S WEEK AND RENEWAL SERVICES

Allegheny Mennonite Conference sponsors a Minister's Study Week each spring which is regularly attended by Pastor Merle and others from Pinto. This year, the teacher is Marion Bontrager from Hesston College.

We are fortunate that Marion will then be leading us during our Spring Renewal services.

Following is a brief biography of Marion's life and ministry. Hopefully, you will have a chance to become personally acquainted while he is with us.


Marion G. Bontrager grew up near Goshen, Indiana in an Old Order Amish family. After accepting Christ at age 13 at a Mennonite Revival service, his parents let him choose where he went to church. He chose Clinton Frame Mennonite, where he was baptized and nurtured. His parents later joined the same church. After he had pastored for 6 years, he attended the Festival of the Holy Spirit, where he had another major spiritual experience when he received the Baptism of the Holy Spirit.

He graduated from Bethany Christian High School in 1955, Hesston College in 1957, Goshen College in 1959, and Goshen Biblical Seminary in 1963. He also studied at Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, Kentucky; and St. Paul's School of Theology in Kansas City, Missouri.

Marion was a part-time teacher at Bethany Christian High School during seminary studies. He served as pastor at Friendship Mennonite Church, a non-traditional church in suburban Cleveland, Ohio, from 1963-69. From 1966-72 he was a youth minister for Ohio and Eastern Conference. He was a teacher, counselor, and campus pastor at Central Christian High School from 1969-73.

## MAY 18 DESIGNATED AS DAY OF PRAYER

On May 18, Mennonite Mission Network invites you to pray for mission. As we work at developing leaders, equipping local congregations, empowering global ministries, and training people for peace and justice... your prayers are needed!



Also, you know the unique ways that your own church is engaged in local mission and other than MMN ministries. What is your church doing? What are ways that you can pray for your church's mission as well as the mission of the church around the world?

**How can you pray?** You can use Mission Mosaic or Prayer Vine to help guide you as you pray.

Here are a few ways to get started:

- Organize a prayer clock. Divide the day into periods when people in your group can agree to be in prayer.
- Maintain an attitude of prayer. We spend a surprising amount of time each day, waiting. Redeem that unused time for a day by dedicating it to prayer.
- Organize a group. Do you have a prayer or Bible study group? Perhaps you could use the Day of Prayer as a time to enlist the help of others to join you in a day of mission-focused prayer.
- Log onto our Facebook page. Follow the day's prayer requests, post your own prayer, or join others in praying for a specific prayer.
- Centering prayer. One of many types of prayer, centering prayer, allows us to focus on a particular subject, such as the work that is done around the world on the Lord's behalf. Find a quiet place, in both our physical setting and within ourselves, that is set apart for the specific purpose of prayer.
- Praying the scriptures. A particular Bible verse, chosen for its relevance or inspiration, becomes the focus of our attention and source of our prayer.

From 1973 to the present time he has been involved with the religious life ministry at Hesston College, teaching in the Bible and Ministry Department, General Education courses, and the Pastoral Ministries Program. In 1986 he created the required liberal arts course, Introduction to Biblical Literature. Over 5000 students have taken this course at Hesston.

Marion has served on the Peace and Service Committee of South Central Mennonite Confer-ence, was moderator for South Central from 2010-12, and has served as a regional confer-ence minister for the conference. He has also written Sunday school curriculum.

Throughout his years, Marion has traveled widely in the Mennonite Church. During college and seminary days he was involved in church-wide MYF and speaking assignments from Hesston College. More recently, he has presented the Bible as Story in 20 different churches and areas in the Mennonite Church from Oregon to Pennsylvania, Mississippi to Ohio and other states.

Marion is the father of three adult children and three grandchildren. His late wife Buetta Wyse passed away in 2006.
